Colonel Fulton due July 16

Col. Larry B. Fulton is expected to take command of FED on July 16. He comes here from an assignment as Egypt area engineer for the Middle East Division, a position he has held since May 1983. The Deputy Commander, Lt. Col. Birchfield, will command the District until his arrival.

Major assignments

Col. Fulton's major command assignments include serving as company commander, 70th and 84th Engineer Battalions, An Khe, Vietnam (1966-1967), and commander, 4th Engineer Battalion, 4th Infantry Division (Mechanized), Fort Carson, Colorado (1977-1979).

Col. Fulton's major staff assignments include serving as assistant director, Directorate of Engineering and Construction, HQUSACE (1982-1983); deputy district engineer at the Corps' Omaha District, Omaha, Nebraska (1979-1981); instructor Department of Tactics, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas (1974-1977); resident engineer, U.S. Army Engineer Command Europe, Augsburg, Germany (1970-1973); executive officer, 20th Engineer Battalion, Pleiku, Vietnam (1969-1970); and atomic demolition munition platoon leader and operations officer, 23rd Engineer Battalion Germany (1963-1966).

Education

Col. Fulton received a

bachelor's degree in civil engineering from the University of Colorado at Boulder in 1963 and a master's degree in civil engineering from Oklahoma State University at Stillwater in 1969. He also is a graduate of the Industrial College of the Armed Forces at Fort McNair, Washington, D.C.

His military awards are the Bronze Star Medal (four awards), Meritorious Service Medal (three awards), and Army Commendation Medal.

Col. Fulton was born in Heyworth, Illinois, and raised in Longmont, Colorado. He is married to the former Deanna Des Neiges Jensen of Longmont. They have one child, Lee Brian, 17.

FED wins Yongsan softball tourney

Powered by the long-ball hitting of Dave Roden and Dennis Fischer, the FED softball team won the Yongsan Memorial Day Tournament. The FED team won six straight games to prevail over the other 29 teams in the three-day, double elimination tournament. Fine defensive play featuring frequent double plays was a major factor in the team's success.

The FED team handled most opponents easily in its drive to the championship. They beat the 125th ATC 15-4, Special U.S. Liaison Advisor-Korea (SUSLAK) 10-0 and the 55th Aviation team 4-0. The lone scare came in the second game when FED trailed J-3 9 to 1 in the late innings. They came up with the nine runs they needed for a 10-9 win that kept in the winners' bracket. Without that win, FED would have gone into the early rounds of the losers' bracket, making the championship a dim hope at best. The 362nd Signal team was another tough opponent as FED only won by a 2-1 score.

The 4-0 win over 55th Aviation put FED in the championship game. A precarious 1-0 FED lead was strengthened by Dennis Fischer's three-run homer over the left field fence. Pitcher Terry Wotherspoon was credited with the shut out.

FED met its earlier-round opponent, SUSLAK, again for the championship. If SUSLAK had won, a second game would have been necessary because they were coming from the losers' bracket. Dave Roden's hitting and Terry Wotherspoon's

pitching took care of that possibility as FED breezed to an 11-4 win and the championship.

In his first two at-bats in the game, Dave sent balls sailing well over the left field fence. SUSLAK came back, however, and it took key hits by several FED'ers, including Capt. Kevin Keating's right-field double to seal the victory. Post-game ceremonies included the presentation of the championship trophy and a \$200 check to FED.

Dennis Fischer finished the tourna-

ment with 3 home runs, and 14 runs batted in (RBI). Dave Roden had a total of 4 home runs and 13 RBI's and Capt. Kevin Keating had 8 RBI's. Terry Wotherspoon was the winning pitcher in every game.

Congratulations to all the players. They worked together to defeat some very well-prepared opponents in this tournament. There are more than two months left in the season so come on out and see some entertaining softball.

MG Heiberg named Chief of Engineers

The Department of Defense recently announced the nomination of Major General E. R. "Vald" Heiberg III to be the next Chief of Engineers of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Heiberg, whose nomination was made by President Reagan, will, when confirmed by the U.S. Senate, succeed Lieutenant General Joseph K. Bratton, who will retire from military service on September 30. Heiberg has also been nominated to the grade of Lieutenant General.

Current position

Heiberg is currently serving as Program Manager of the Ballistic Missile Defense Program under the Office of the Army Chief of Staff. He has

been assigned to this position since May 1983.

Heiberg's previous assignments have included serving as the Deputy Chief of Engineers; Director of Civil Works in the Office of the Chief of Engineers; Deputy Chief of Staff, Engineer, U.S. Army, Europe; Military Assistant and Executive to the Secretary of the Army; chief, Manpower and Structure Team, Planning and Programming Analysis Directorate, Office of the Army Assistant Vice Chief of Staff; and as Special Assistant and Executive Assistant to the Director, Office of Emergency Preparedness under the Executive Office of the President of the United States.

Heiberg has also held command assignments in the

United States and overseas as Division Engineer with the Corps' Ohio River Division; District Engineer with the Corps' New Orleans District; and as Commander of the 4th Engineer Battalion, 4th Infantry Division in Vietnam.

Class of '53

He is a 1953 graduate of the U.S. Military Academy at West Point and has earned three master's degrees, including one in civil engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He is also a graduate of the Army Command and General Staff College and the Industrial College of the Armed Forces.

He has served as one of seven Presidentially-appointed members of the Mississippi

River Commission, and has also served as president of the Coastal Engineering Research Board and as chairman of the U.S. Section, Permanent International Association of Navigation Congresses.

Awards

Among his military awards are the Distinguished Service Medal, Silver Star, three Legions of Merit, Distinguished Flying Cross, Bronze Star Medal, seven Air Medals and two Army Commendation Medals.

Heiberg was born at Schofield Barracks in Honolulu, Hawaii. He and his wife, the former Kitty Schrimpf, a Kansan, have four grown children, Kathy, Walter, "Vin" and Kay.

"Construction Quality" workshops held

Construction Division had a busy month of May as it delivered its "construction quality" message to FED and contractor personnel. Two hundred fifty construction managers from fifty different Korean construction firms attended a Quality Control/Assurance workshop at the Federation of Korean Industries auditorium on May 15. In addition, workshops were held with FED personnel on May 16 and 17 (Northern Area personnel) and May 30 and 31 (Southern Area personnel).

The May 15 session was co-sponsored by the Korean Military Contractors Association (KMCA). After opening remarks by Ro, Kyung Ha, Chairman of KMCA, Ed Tohill, Chief of Construction Division and Col. Perrenot, a series of presentations by FED construction managers covered several technical areas.

Dan Beasley (Chief, S&I) began with a presentation on Quality Management and was followed by Capt. David Dawley (Camp Humphreys), who spoke on preconstruction conferences. Capt. Rich Adams (Camp Casey) then discussed the

special and technical provisions of construction contracts. Following a break, Capt. Greg Bergeret (Osan Resident Office) spoke on contractor quality control plans and Capt. John Fensterer (Taegu Resident Office) covered contractor quality control/quality assurance reports.

After lunch, Jobie Smith, Northern Area Engineer, gave two separate presentations on three-step inspections and quality assurance techniques. Jack Church, Western Corridor Resident Engineer, then spoke on construction quality assurance and enforcement of contractor quality control. The last presentation was given by Capt. Rodney Grayson (Kunsan Resident Office), who talked about safety.

Each presentation was translated into Korean by FED employees. Kim, Che Nam (S&I), Yim, Kwang Chun (Osan), Yi, Kon U (Camp Casey), Clayton Kim (SAO) and O, Sung Sik (Western Corridor Res. Off.) did the translating.

This workshop and the others held with FED personnel are an important first step in the improvement of FED construction quality control and quality assurance procedures.

"Professional Engineer" more than nice title

The "P.E." after an engineer's name is no longer just a "nice-to-have" adornment. Now it is not only the mark of an engineer's professionalism but is also a requirement for selection to many key positions in the Corps of Engineers. For instance, at the district level, you must be a P.E. to be selected as Chief of Engineering or Construction Division, Assistant Chief of Engineer-

ing or Chief of Design Branch. Except for Chief, Design Branch, the same is true at Division level.

The Engineer-in-Training and Professional Engineer examinations are offered in Yongsan twice a year, usually in April and October. Arrangements can be made through the 8th Army Engineer's Office to apply for and take either test. The examinations are for registra-

tion as a Professional Engineer in the State of Minnesota.

Publications to help prepare for the examinations are available in Korea. If you have any questions on how to obtain professional engineer registration while in Korea, contact Thayne Coffin, Chief of Engineering Division. He is the Engineer Career Advisor.


Dan Beasley, Chief of Construction Division's S&I






Mil. Br. wins V-Ball title


to many of their victories, however, are timely hits by everyone in the line-up.
